This year, we would like to help people in the local community. The local foodbank would, therefore, be very grateful for any non-perishable and in-date items. There are lots of items that they need but in particular:

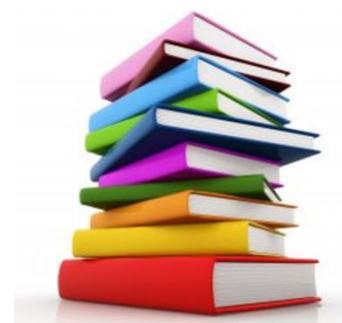


- Long life fruit juice and squash

Breakfast

Some of our children arrive at school without breakfast and this can have an impact on their focus and learning during the day. Below are some facts relating to the importance of breakfast.

- After going without food for 8 to 10 hours during sleep, breakfast gives your child's body the fuel it needs for the day.
- Children who eat breakfast tend to eat healthier overall, are more likely to participate in physical activities, and to maintain a healthy body weight.
- Eating breakfast helps a child's attention span, concentration and memory—all important for learning in school.

If your child tells us they haven't had breakfast we will of course call you to check. We can give them a piece of fruit or something similar to help them get through to lunchtime.

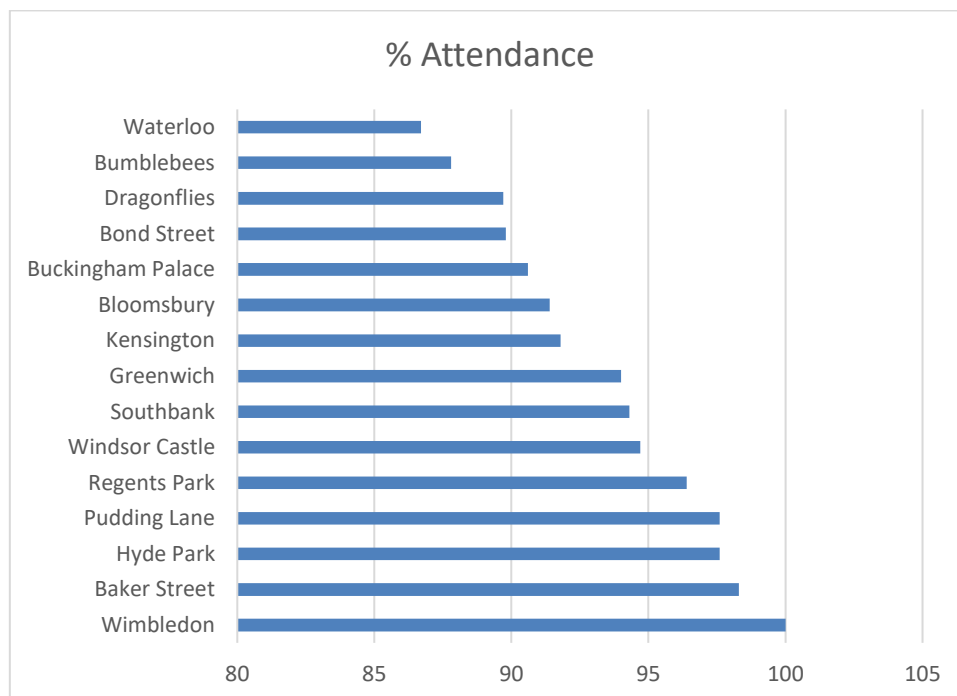
