## Online Safety

**At School we wish to keep all our children safe online and we are aware that online abuse can be very traumatic to those it is aimed at. Below is guidance to support you and your children taken from the Gov.uk website:**

### Keep your child safe online

It is important to have regular conversations about staying safe online and to encourage children to speak to you if they come across something worrying online.

Talk to your child about the importance of creating a safe online environment, including keeping any log-in details and passwords safe.

These resources will support you to talk to your child about a range of online safety issues, set up home filtering in a child-friendly way and set up age-appropriate parental controls on digital devices:

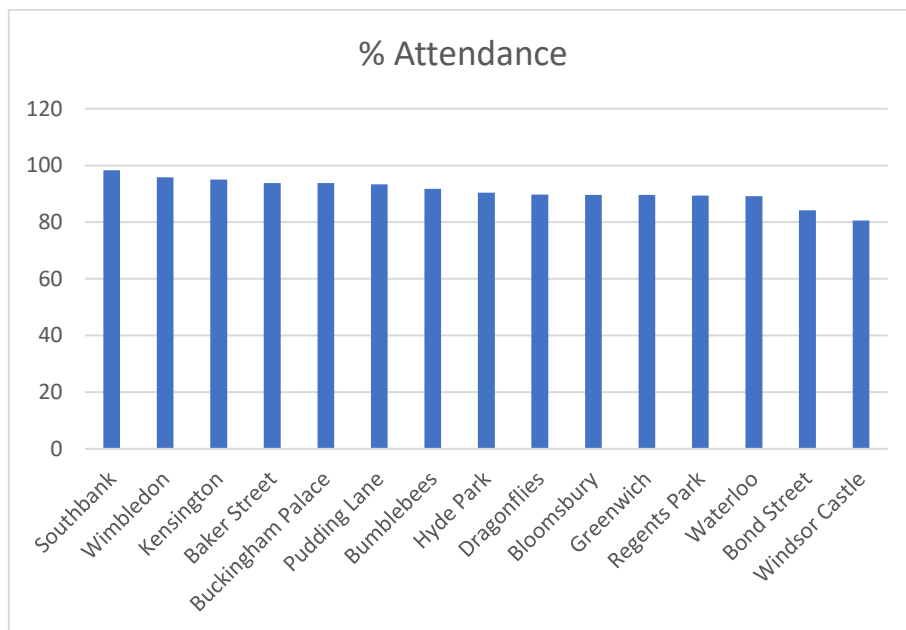

**All Aboard Club runs inclusive train play sessions for autistic, ADHD and special needs children. The children can build and play with our huge train sets in a safe, understanding and supportive environment.**

• We run play sessions in Streatham, Woking, Sutton, Brentford, Hounslow, Biggin Hill, Weybridge and Lewisham. Please check our website [www.allaboardclub.com](http://www.allaboardclub.com) for details.

At our play sessions, the children are in charge. They can run the trains, build the track, and sort out any problems. It builds their confidence, reduces their anxiety, and allows them to play for hours, while developing their social and communication skills.

We'll be running these sessions in the Community Space, inside the Tesco Extra superstore in Addlestone. The Community Space is on the 1st floor, at the back of the clothing section - look out for our All Aboard Club signs. Please note that children will need to be supervised by a parent or carer throughout the session - so no sneaking off to do your shopping!

All Aboard Club staff and volunteers have lived experience of autism and ADHD, so we understand the children's challenges. We do everything possible to make the sessions as accessible and inclusive as possible for each and every child.

Our sessions are suitable for children and siblings aged 4 and upwards. A parent or adult carer needs to stay for the whole session.
