**SIX TOP TIPS**  
For Parents To Keep Your Children Safe Online

Children and young people are bound to spend lots more time on devices since Covid. **DON'T FEEL BAD** – lots will be schoolwork or healthy ways of catching up with friends or having fun. There are many ways to keep them safe, healthy and happy.

**Don't worry about screen time; aim for screen quality**  
Scrolling through social media isn't the same as making a film or story, or Skyping Grandma. Use the Children's Commissioner's 'Digital Five A Day' to plan or review each day together.

**Check the safety settings are turned on**  
Whether it's your home internet, mobile devices, consoles, apps or games, there are lots of settings to make them safer. The key ones are - can they chat to strangers, can they video chat or 'go live', are their posts public? **Internet Matters** has hundreds of guides to parental controls.

**Get your children to show you their apps and games**  
You don't need to know all about the latest app or game, but if your child shows you what they are doing and with whom, you'll probably see if it's appropriate or not. Remember 18 games are not more advanced – they are harmful to children! For parent guides to apps, including recommendations for kidsafe apps and video platforms, search for **Common Sense Media** or **NSPCC's NetAware**. And why not download the **BBC Own It** app?

**Don't try to hide news about scary things in the news**  
If you don't talk about it, your children might read inappropriate pages, believe scare stories or simply catastrophise in their heads. Why not watch **Newsround** together and talk about how they feel – there is guidance from **Childline** to help you.

**Remind them of key online safety principles**  
There are too many to list, but remember human behaviour is the same online and offline. Remind your children to be a good friend, to ask for help if they are worried or if someone is mean, not to get undressed on camera and most important of all... if somebody tells them not to tell or ask for help because it's too late or they will get in trouble, **THAT'S A LIE!**

**If you aren't sure, ASK!**  
Your school may be able to give you advice, but there are plenty of other places to ask for help as a parent or a child, whether it is advice or help to fix something. Lots of sites are listed at **reporting.lgfl.net**, including ones to tell your kids about (they might not want to talk to you in the first instance).

## Year 4 Rural Life Living Museum Trip

On Tuesday, 16 May 2023 Year 4 visited the Rural Life Living Museum in Tilford, Farnham. The trip was to support our learning in History and English about The Victorians. The pupils got to see a Victorian classroom first hand and how the Victorian children engaged in their daily learning. Victorian children learnt mainly the 3Rs which was Arithmetic, Reading and Writing. They completed daily drills to support their learning through repetition, chanting and using mnemonics to recall facts.

The children engaged with the teachers at the workshop who were in character from the Victorian era; and they were very strict in role! We also learnt an old Victorian chant from the teachers, which was heard amongst the children on our way back to school, – *“Good, better, best. Never let it rest. Until your good is better and your better is best.”*

Some of the other short excursions included visiting the old shops, flour mill storage, holiday cottage, a bike and shoe cobbler shops, as well as viewing other Victorian artefacts and vehicles. The children came home with a huge smile on their face with countless number of stories to share. They were excited throughout the trip and often posing lots of enquiring questions. Well done Year 4 and a big thank you to all our parents and carers.

## Hampton Court Palace

Year 2 had a great day on Thursday exploring Hampton Court Palace as part of their history topic this term. The children got to experience what the Palace is like first hand. Particular highlights were meeting a Queen from the past, learning a Tudor dance and how to bow to a King and seeing a replica of Henry VIII’s crown.

Some clubs are run by external providers and some by staff. If you are interested in your child joining a club please contact the school office to see if there are spaces and what the charges are.

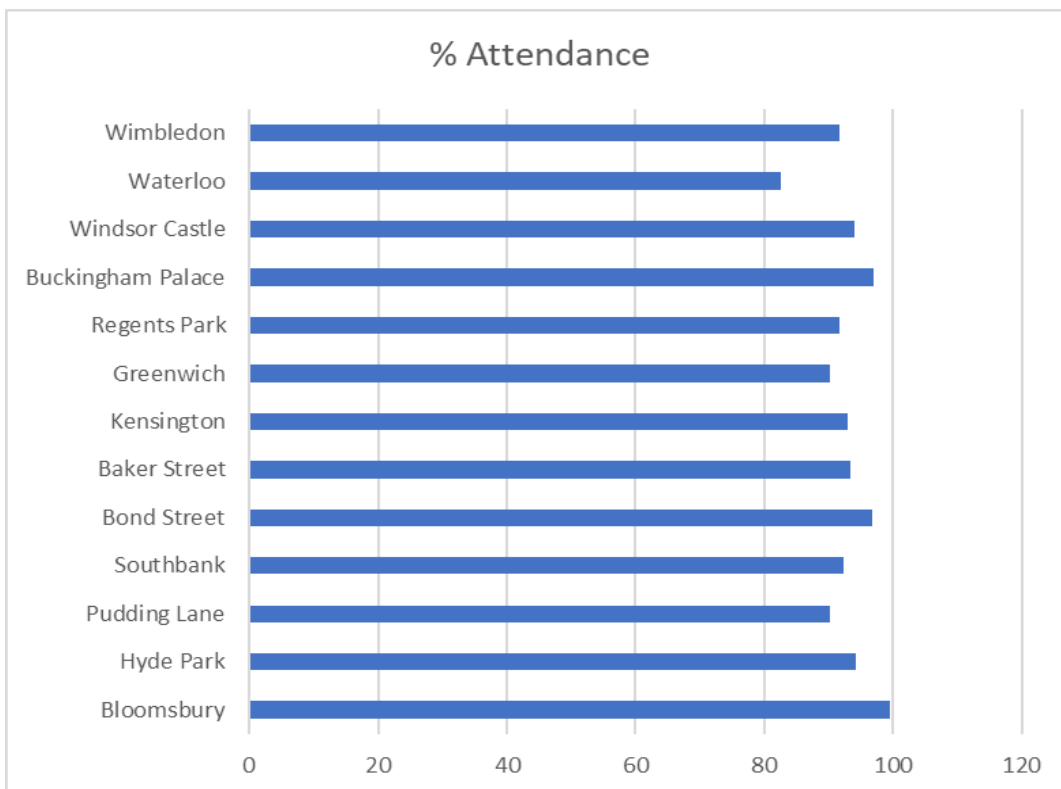
