Phonics Screening



- National requirement at the end of Year 1 in June.
- Not a formal test
- A way to check that children are making sufficient progress with their phonics skills to read words to help make them a fluent reader.

Phonics



- It checks that your child can:
 - Sound out and blend graphemes in order to read simple words.
 - Read phonically decodable one-syllable and twosyllable words, e.g. cat, sand, windmill.
 - Read a selection of nonsense words which are referred to as pseudo words.

How to help your child



- Read with them and record in their diaries
- Encourage them
- Explore with them
- Encourage independence
- Engage them in conversations about their learning
- Look at mistakes as building resilience
- Home Learning
- Come along to parent meetings and discussion groups
