Football Reports

A chance for children aged 7 to 16 in Surrey to try a new activity for FREE!

Active Surrey are offering some AMAZING activity options for complete beginners this spring. Kids & teenagers - learn to dance, try out judo, give basketball a spin, plus more!

How does it work?

We're offering 6-8 weeks of completely funded training after Easter. All the sessions are for beginners and fully inclusive. What activities are on offer?

Boccia
School Years 3 - 11

Boccia - pronounced 'Bot-cha' - is a fast-growing, paralympic sport. It's a fun game of strategy and accuracy, played indoors on a court similar in size to a badminton court. Participants throw, kick or use a ramp to propel a ball with the aim of getting closest to a 'jack' ball. Players can compete as an individual, in pairs, or as a team of three.

Dance
School Years 3 - 6

Unleash your inner rhythm and discover new moves! An amazing way to get fit and improve balance and agility. Dance is also great way to be part of a new crew and to lift your mood.

Girls Touch Rugby
School Years 5 - 8

Judo
Aged between 8 and 12 on the 15th June 2024

Judo is a modern Japanese martial art and incredibly popular Olympic sport. Beginners will learn throws, groundwork and learning to fall safely – it's also a great workout, which benefits lots of other sports! The word Judo means 'the gentle way' and it teaches self-respect, self-control and discipline in a fun and safe environment.

Tennis
School Year 3

Tennis is a great workout and fantastic for coordination and agility, as well as developing strategic skills. It's also a handy sport to play socially as you only need one other player!

In the training, you'll learn the fundamental skills to help your enjoyment of this sport long after the games have finished!

Street Basketball
School Years 7 - 8
